 - Benefits first day of classes went smooth and classes were quicker into lessons and it was easier on parents.
 - ~65% of supplies purchased at start of year Revisit the topic in February 2018 to determine current state of supplies.

 - EICS received a one-time grant from Alberta government of \$796,000 which was allocated to each school based on enrollment EPK received \$21,000.
 - Funds are allocated into two categories:
 - A. \$13,000 for connections project
 - B. \$8,000 for makerspaces/reading commons/library improvements
