STARTING KINDERGARTEN WITH EASE

Small Group Orientation: Reserve Yours Today!

We are so excited to welcome your child to their first year at Ecole Pere Kenneth Kearns. It is a privilege to be part of their learning journey and we can't wait to get started.

Recognizing that coming to school for the first time may be a little stressful on young children (and parents too), we are planning a slight deviation from a typical day. On your child's first day of school, August 31st 2023, he/she will attend for half a day only. Smaller groups have been organized, allowing for a less busy and a more gentle beginning. For your assigned day your child will either attend from 9:00 - 11:00 am or 12:30 - 2:30 pm. Your child should bring a small snack and a bottle of water. Please verify the date and start time at the bottom of this letter. On your child's next scheduled day, September 5th, classes will resume to regular hours, drop off can begin @ 8:30 and dismissal is at 3:11. They will also be able to access the bus if that is what your family has planned. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact the school.

WHERE TO PARK

- Visitor parking is available in any stall in front of the school
- Back parking lot
- On Flamingo Drive.

Our Drop Off Lane has supervision beginning at 8:30 am. If your child is dropped off after 8:42 am please have them enter through the front door. After school, the PICK-UP Lane will be open after the

buses have left. This lane is **not intended** for parents to park and exit their vehicle. If you wish to walk your child to their classroom in the morning or greet them at the front of school at the end of the day please park on the street or in the assigned parking stalls.





WHAT TO BRING

We ask that your child brings the following personal items:

- A pair of runners with white soles, preferably with Velcro closure (to be kept at school)
- Backpack & Lunch Kit
- Water Bottle
- A set of spare clothing for your child (pants, shirt, socks and underwear in a labeled Ziploc bag – Which will be left at school)



Please label these items with your child's name so they can easily be identified and returned if misplaced.

Please bring all supplies to your Staggered Entry Session.

SHOOL FEES (FIELD TRIPS AND ENHANCED PROGRAMMING)



To ensure student safety, we check student attendance in the morning and afternoon.

TAKING THE BUS

If you coordinated bussing through EICS, it will officially begin Thursday, August 31st 2023. Your child's bus driver will notify you by phone just prior to school starting as to the time and location of your child's pick-up. Please make sure you ask



the bus driver for the number of the bus your child will be taking to **return** home after school.

Your child will receive bus passes within the first few days of school. We strongly encourage you to attach these passes to the outside of your child's backpack so that it is easily visible. This will assist your child as well as the staff in ensuring your child boards the correct bus.



If you have applied for bussing on your registration, to date, no further information is available regarding routes. If you have not yet requested bussing, and would like to, please go to www.eics.ab.ca and click **Transportation** to complete an application.



Transferring buses may be necessary for some students, even in kindergarten. Don't worry, the students are well taken care of and they learn quickly. You can help by ensuring bus passes as well as bus numbers are visible on the exterior of your child's backpack. There are always supervisors at transfer points to help ensure children get to their correct bus. Please encourage your child to go to a supervisor (usually wearing a reflective vest) if they are confused.

GETTING INVOLVED

TIPS FOR A SUCCESSFUL START

For some children, starting kindergarten might sound super exciting, but for others, it is quite intimidating. After all, a child has to experience and adjust to a completely new environment which can be pretty scary (even for parents). If your child is having mixed feelings about starting kindergarten, don't worry about it. It is absolutely normal to feel overwhelmed with different emotions. Here are a few back to school tips for parents of kindergarteners!

Get a school routine going early

Summertime schedules are often different from school year schedules, and there's nothing wrong with that. However, kids do well with routines so establishing a school routine early is important.

Get appropriate gear for your kindergartener

There are tons of cute and fun school supplies out there! A tiny backpack is not very useful. The backpack should be able to hold a water bottle, a lunch bag, occasional treasures and books.

Talk and read about school

Listen to your kindergartener and answer any questions they might have. Share insights into when you were in school and all the fun you had there. Books about school are a great way to generate conversation.

Encourage independence

While no one expects a 5 year old to do everything on their own, age appropriate independence is important. Some important tasks would include dressing and toileting themselves and cleaning up after themselves. While perfection isn't necessary, working towards independence is the goal.



Prepare for back-to-school emotions

Sometimes young children deal with separation anxiety when school time rolls around. Honestly, some parents have trouble separating from their children too. In both cases, those feelings are totally normal! Many of the above tips will help ease school anxieties. Children adjust to new experiences and in no time they will wave good-bye to you and join their friends to have a morning of fun.
